


Tutorial 2. Aug. 16, 2007.

Q.



Velocity of craft relative to water is $V_R = \begin{bmatrix} 5\sin 30 \\ 5\cos 30 \end{bmatrix}$

Let drift velocity of water $V_D = \begin{bmatrix} V \sin \theta \\ V \cos \theta \end{bmatrix}$, θ - course of the drift.

The range rate measurements result from the total velocity $V_R + V_D$ of the craft relative to shore.

The range rate measurements are related to the total velocity by

$$\dot{P}_A = [\sin \vartheta_A \quad \cos \vartheta_A] (V_R + V_D)$$

$$+ \dot{P}_B = [\sin \vartheta_B \quad \cos \vartheta_B] (V_R + V_D)$$

where $\vartheta_A = 35 + 30^\circ$ is the true bearing to A

+ $\vartheta_B = 135 + 30 = 165^\circ$ is the true bearing to B.

$$\therefore \begin{bmatrix} \sin 65^\circ & \cos 65^\circ \\ \sin 165^\circ & \cos 165^\circ \end{bmatrix} \begin{bmatrix} 5\sin 30^\circ + V \sin \theta \\ 5\cos 30^\circ + V \cos \theta \end{bmatrix} = \begin{bmatrix} 3.3 \\ -2.5 \end{bmatrix}$$

$$\therefore V \begin{bmatrix} \sin \theta \\ \cos \theta \end{bmatrix} = \frac{1}{\sin(65 - 165^\circ)} \begin{bmatrix} \cos 165 & -\cos 65 \\ -\sin 165 & \sin 65 \end{bmatrix} \begin{bmatrix} 3.3 \\ -2.5 \end{bmatrix} = \begin{bmatrix} 5/2 \\ 5\sqrt{3}/2 \end{bmatrix}$$

$$= \begin{bmatrix} 2.163 \\ 3.168 \end{bmatrix} - \begin{bmatrix} 2.5 \\ 4.33 \end{bmatrix} = \begin{bmatrix} -0.337 \\ -1.162 \end{bmatrix}$$

$\therefore V = 1.21$ knots \rightarrow magnitude of drift

$\theta = 196.17^\circ$. \rightarrow true course angle of drift

3. On Aug. 16, 2007, (DATA From www.tecepe.com.br)

$$\text{GHA of Aries} = 249^\circ 47.5' = 249.8^\circ$$

$$\text{SHA of Vega} = 80^\circ 41.7'$$

$$\therefore \text{GHA of Vega } t_1 = \text{SHA} + \text{GHA} = 330.486^\circ$$

$$\text{Declination of Vega } \delta_1 = 38^\circ 47.5' = 38.79^\circ$$

\therefore unit vector to Vega is

$$\begin{aligned} u_1 &= [\cos \delta_1 \cos t_1, -\cos \delta_1 \sin t_1, \sin \delta_1]^T \\ &= [0.6783 \ 0.384 \ 0.6264]^T \end{aligned}$$

$$\text{SHA of Deneb} = 49.57^\circ$$

$$\therefore \text{GHA of Deneb } t_2 = 299.361^\circ$$

$$\text{Declination } \delta_2 = 45^\circ 18.5' = 45.308^\circ$$

\therefore unit vector to Deneb is

$$\begin{aligned} u_2 &= [\cos \delta_2 \cos t_2, -\cos \delta_2 \sin t_2, \sin \delta_2]^T \\ &= [0.3448 \ 0.613 \ 0.711]^T \end{aligned}$$

The zenith angles are

$$\text{Vega: } \underline{\theta_2} = 2_1 = 90 - 47.65^\circ = 42.35^\circ$$

$$\text{Deneb: } 2_2 = 90 - 61.43^\circ = 28.57^\circ$$

$$g = u_1 \times u_2 = \begin{bmatrix} 0 & -0.6264 & 0.384 \\ 0.6264 & 0 & -0.6783 \\ -0.384 & 0.6783 & 0 \end{bmatrix} \begin{bmatrix} 0.3448 \\ 0.613 \\ 0.711 \end{bmatrix}$$

$$= [-0.11 \quad -0.2663 \quad 0.2833]^T$$

$$h = \cos^2 u_1 - \cos^2 u_2$$

$$= \cos(28.57) \begin{bmatrix} 0.6783 \\ 0.384 \\ 0.6264 \end{bmatrix} - \cos(42.35^\circ) \begin{bmatrix} 0.3448 \\ 0.613 \\ 0.711 \end{bmatrix} = \begin{bmatrix} 0.3408 \\ -0.1158 \\ 0.0246 \end{bmatrix}$$

$$(g \times h) = \begin{bmatrix} 0 & -0.2833 & -0.2663 \\ 0.2833 & 0 & 0.11 \\ 0.2663 & -0.11 & 0 \end{bmatrix} \begin{bmatrix} 0.3408 \\ -0.1158 \\ 0.0246 \end{bmatrix} = \begin{bmatrix} 0.0263 \\ 0.099 \\ 0.1035 \end{bmatrix}$$

$$a_2 = \frac{1}{g^T g} = 6.127 \quad a_1 = \frac{\sqrt{g^T g - h^T h}}{g^T g} = 1.098$$

The two points at the intersection of the two LOPs are

$$r_1 = a_1 g + a_2 (g \times h) = 1.098 \begin{bmatrix} -0.11 \\ -0.2663 \\ 0.2833 \end{bmatrix} + 6.127 \begin{bmatrix} 0.0263 \\ 0.099 \\ 0.1035 \end{bmatrix} = \begin{bmatrix} 0.040 \\ 0.3141 \\ 0.9452 \end{bmatrix}$$

1. ^{longitude}
Latitude is given by $\tan \lambda_1 = \frac{0.3141}{0.04} = 7.8525 \therefore \lambda_1 = 82.74^\circ$

$$\frac{\text{latitude}}{\text{longitude}} \sin \varphi_1 = 0.9452 \Rightarrow \varphi_1 = 70.94^\circ.$$

The other point is


$$r_2 = -a, g + \alpha_2 (g \times u)$$

$$= -1.098 \begin{bmatrix} -0.11 \\ -0.2663 \\ 0.2833 \end{bmatrix} + 6.127 \begin{bmatrix} 0.0263 \\ 0.099 \\ 0.1035 \end{bmatrix} = \begin{bmatrix} 0.2819 \\ 0.2982 \\ 0.3230 \end{bmatrix}$$

$$\frac{\text{latitude}_1}{\text{longitude}_1} \tan \lambda_2 = \frac{0.2982}{0.2819} = 3.186 \Rightarrow \lambda_2 = 72.57^\circ$$

$$\frac{\text{latitude}}{\text{longitude}} \sin \varphi_2 = 0.3230 \therefore \varphi_2 = 18.84^\circ.$$

The correct answer coordinates for Mumbai are $18.84^\circ N, 72.57^\circ E$, since Mumbai is to the south of the Tropic of Cancer.



Choosing the origin at A, $r_A = [0 \ 0]^T$, $r_B = [-0.8, -0.35]^T$.

At the 1st observation, the true bearings of A & B are

$$\theta_{A_1} = 30 + 23.5^\circ = 53.5^\circ$$

$$\theta_{B_1} = 30 + 96.2^\circ = 126.2^\circ$$

Position fix from the 1st observation is

$$\begin{bmatrix} \cos\theta_A, & -\sin\theta_A, \\ \cos\theta_B, & -\sin\theta_B, \end{bmatrix} r_1 = \begin{bmatrix} 0 \\ -0.8\cos\theta_B + 0.35\sin\theta_B, \end{bmatrix}$$

$$\therefore r_1 = \frac{1}{\sin(\theta_A - \theta_B)} \begin{bmatrix} -\sin 126.2^\circ & \sin 53.5^\circ \\ -\cos 126.2^\circ & \cos 53.5^\circ \end{bmatrix} \begin{bmatrix} 0 \\ 0.75 \end{bmatrix}$$

$$\therefore r_1 = \begin{bmatrix} -0.6356 & -0.4703 \end{bmatrix}^T$$

For the 2nd observation, $\theta_{A_2} = 65^\circ$, $\theta_{B_2} = 137.5^\circ$

$$\begin{bmatrix} \cos\theta_{A_2} & -\sin\theta_{A_2} \\ \cos\theta_{B_2} & -\sin\theta_{B_2} \end{bmatrix} r_2 = \begin{bmatrix} 0 \\ -0.8\cos\theta_{B_2} + 0.35\sin\theta_{B_2} \end{bmatrix} = \begin{bmatrix} 0 \\ 0.8262 \end{bmatrix}$$

$$\therefore r_2 = \frac{1}{\sin(65 - 137.5)} \begin{bmatrix} -\sin 137.5^\circ & \sin 65^\circ \\ -\cos 137.5^\circ & \cos 65^\circ \end{bmatrix} \begin{bmatrix} 0 \\ 0.8262 \end{bmatrix} = \begin{bmatrix} -0.705 \\ -0.3661 \end{bmatrix}$$

$$\therefore \text{True velocity } V_T = \frac{1}{t} (r_2 - r_1) = \begin{bmatrix} -1.793 \\ 1.25 \end{bmatrix} \text{ knots.}$$

$$V_T = V_R + D_D.$$

$$\text{Relative velocity } V_R = \begin{bmatrix} 1.4 \sin 320^\circ & 1.4 \cos 320^\circ \end{bmatrix}^T = \begin{bmatrix} -0.899 & 1.072 \end{bmatrix}^T$$

$$\therefore \text{drift velocity } V_D = V_T - V_R = \begin{bmatrix} -0.894 & 0.172 \end{bmatrix}.$$

\therefore drift = 0.911 knots with a true course of 281.26° ,
