In February 2007, SAFRAN and the French Embassy in Delhi had launched a contest to reward the best doctoral theses in aerospace and/or technology of communication in partnership with prominent scientific institutions in the country.

Last month, a jury of six eminent scientists including: Dr C.G. Krishnadas Nair (former head of Hindustan Aeronautics Limited – HAL, Current SIATI President), Dr Haridwar Singh (former director and emeritus scientist of DRDO) and Dr Shiva Prasad (head of the Indo-French Centre for the Promotion of Advanced Research (CEFIPRA), selected the three best candidates among the young researchers' theses.

François Courtot, SAFRAN Senior Vice President, International Affairs, explained the objective of these awards: "SAFRAN, the French Embassy in India and the main Indian Research Institutes, aim to highlight and promote the value of research and engineering in the aerospace and technology of communication sectors and the inter-dependence between research and the industry". Prof. Bernard Heulin, Scientific Counselor for Science and Technology at the French Embassy and also one of the members of the jury added: "The level of the theses was high and it was very difficult for the jury to make the selection".

The winners of these awards are:

Dr. S Kumar, from the IISc Bangalore: First SAFRAN prize (5,000 euros and a one-week travel to France, along with his research guide, to visit some of the SAFRAN research and industrial sites).

Dr. A.M. Pradeep from the IIT Kanpur : Second SAFRAN prize (3,000 euros and a one-week travel to France, along with his research guide, to visit some of the SAFRAN research and industrial sites).
